



# Zone Parking at NNS

February 2021

**In March, Newport News Shipbuilding will implement a zone parking system in all company-owned parking lots.** With the arrival of USS *John C. Stennis* (CVN 74) and USS *Gerald R. Ford* (CVN 78) later this year, more people – including contractors, sailors and government personnel – will enter shipyard gates daily. Even with a significant number of employees continuing to work remotely, parking will once again become a challenge. The transition to a zone-based system is to ensure NNS employees have adequate parking.

As a result, the company will create three new Zones – A, B, C. The majority of NNS’ workforce will be assigned to Zone A or B. The following changes will begin Monday, March 15.

### The following parking areas will transition to Zones A and B:

- Aqua, blue and silver hangtags
- Bldg. 600 (red and white hangtags)
- Zones 3 and 5

### The following parking areas will remain the same:

- Bldg. 902 and 903 (Zones 1 and 2)
- Brooks Crossing (Zone 4)
- Beside *Dorothy* (Zone 11)
- NetCenter
- West Park
- Commute with Enterprise
- Handicap
- Expectant Mother
- Motorcycle
- Visitors

### Group Riders:

- The requirement to become a group rider will change from two employees per vehicle to three.
- Employees opting to group ride will forgo their individually assigned hangtag; instead the group will be assigned one Zone A hangtag.
- When members of the group commute to work individually, they will need to park in Zone C, which does not require a hangtag.

### General Information:

- NNS does not anticipate employees will have trouble finding parking. However, if no parking is available in the zone they are assigned, employees should park in Zone C and use company transportation to NNS gates. No hangtag is required for this zone.
- Security and the Parking and Transportation team will continuously monitor parking lots to ensure parking spaces are used effectively.
- NNS shuttles will continue operating on their normal schedule.
- Employees with oversized vehicles are required to park in Zone C. Hangtags are not required for this zone.
- In preparation for the March 15 implementation, employees will see new signage posted in NNS parking lots. Open parking will remain in place through Sunday, March 14.
- Each division has a parking point of contact responsible for distributing new hangtags for Zones A and B. Distribution will take place through March 15.
  - Hangtags should be displayed outward facing with the zone number and barcode easily visible through the windshield of the vehicle.
  - Hangtags will serve as parking credentials and will be linked to employees by their PERNR.
  - Employees are not permitted to share or let other employees use their hangtag. The zone-based parking system works by accounting for employees who are working remotely or out of the office.
- Vehicles parked illegally or without proper credentials will be towed at the owner’s expense.



**Zone A:** Master Shipbuilders, group riders and salaried employees level 4 and above.

- Located in various parking lots across the shipyard.



**Zone B:** Hourly employees and salaried employees levels 1-3.

- Located in various parking lots across the shipyard.



**Zone C:** Contractors, leased employees and overflow parking for NNS employees.

- Located at Hidens.
- No hangtag required.
- Shuttles will provide transportation between NNS and Zone C parking.
